On the perimeter of the living room's custom-designed gray frieze love seats reside several refined wood pieces, including an antique French case clock, a Beidermeier chest, and a carved pedestal sculpture that was originally part of an antique French wine press. A pair of hyacinth husk vases add natural texture.
